




OVERALL TRENDS

There has been a decrease in people buying with a mortgage and more people owning outright.



Private renters have been steadily increasing since 2001.



Social renting has been on the decline, with housing increasingly being provided by housing associations instead of councils.


YOUNG PEOPLE


59% of people who live in the country are opposed to the building of new homes.
